SCHEDULE OF FEES

Guidance notes on current charges 2023/24

This note, while not comprehensive, explains the basis for certain charges which will appear on this year's invoices. The College's Terms and Conditions can be found in the [Parent Contract](#), also available on the College website.

Fees

The fees for the academic year 2023/24 are £16,025 per term. Fees are due in full on the first day of each term by direct debit or bank transfer. Unless special arrangements have been agreed in advance, an administration fee of £50 will be charged on payment made by any other means. In the event of delay, late payment charges (presently calculated at the rate of 1.00% per month) will be levied. If a direct debit is returned unpaid and has to be represented, there is an administration charge of £20.

The College operates an optional **Fees Refund Scheme** at a cost of £152 per term (being 0.95% of termly fees) to provide a refund of fees for absence due to illness or accident for a continuous period of at least 4 days. Insurances

Various insurances are available on a group or individual basis and parents should check the relevant policy leaflet carefully for precise details as to the cover provided. While the College cannot recommend a particular company, we wish to make you aware of the following insurances. We encourage parents to read the insurers' literature carefully, as any contract entered into is optional and is with the insurance company. The current rates are:

AXA PPP Healthcare private medical insurance £126 per term

Pupils' Personal Effects Scheme (for lower value items subject to £25 claim excess) £5,000 cover subject to a limit on any one article of £2,000, and only £350 for bicycles (theft only covered if cycle locked to immovable object or in locked building). £7.73 per term

Personal Accident insurance is included within the overall termly fees and all pupils are automatically covered. Details of the cover provided are available from the Bursary. No extra cost

Academic Support

This generally takes place during Central Hour, after Games or in Prep for Lower School boys and in Study Periods for Upper School boys. Boys with EAL needs, specific learning difficulties or boys who have been referred to the Academic Support Department requiring additional specialised help in a small group or on an individual basis will be charged £170 per term, with shorter interventions charged accordingly. (£100 in the Summer term for boys in the Vth Form or in 6.2). If boys do ad hoc lessons this will be charged at £18 per lesson.

Additional charges may be applicable for boys receiving more bespoke support. We are also able to provide specialist assessment for access arrangements and full cognitive/literacy/intelligence profiling. These are charged for separately depending on the level of assessment and, if a boy is formally assessed, there is also a one-off charge of £50 for the administration and dissemination of information and advice.

Beagling

Boys are charged a cap of £5 for each day's beagling, up to a maximum of £50 per season (September-March) at which point they become a subscriber and there are no further charges for that season. Alternatively, parents may choose to purchase a family subscription, which covers all their sons at Radley and any family members who come beagling. A family subscription costs £120 per season; please contact the Bursary for further details.

Boat Club Charges

Wet bobs charges cover a Boat Club charge (which includes a small subscription to the Radley Mariners) and the annual rowing registration fee levied by British Rowing. Wet bobs are charged at £130 in each of the Lent and Summer Terms. The annual rowing registration fee levied by British Rowing from 1 April 2022 is a flat fee of £30 and is a requirement for all participating in rowing activities. This charge will be split across the two terms charges, if a boy elects to take up rowing in the second term, an additional £15 will be incurred to cover this cost.

Careers

Parents are asked in the Michaelmas Term of the Vth Form if they would like their son to undergo career profiling. We offer a course run by FutureSmart Careers. The cost is currently £183 and covers psychometric testing, two careers' interviews (one in the Lent Term of the Vth Form and the other in the Summer Term of 6.1) and a comprehensive report. In addition, the service gives access to courses and a careers website.

For boys in 6.1 and 6.2, interview technique courses are offered and delivered by Impact Education Ltd. These are charged at cost and details will be provided in advance.

CCF

Boys join the CCF at the start of the Summer Term of the Shell year for a non-uniform programme of Adventure Training and pre-CCF preparation. They begin their military training at the start of the Remove year, when there is a one-off charge of £220, which covers all equipment and uniform, including boots, field weekend and camp, apart from the Adventure Training camps for which there is a nominal charge of £45 - £195 depending on the activities. The charge will be included on the invoice payable at the start of the Michaelmas Term that boys enter the Removes.

Clubs & Societies

These are largely run by the boys themselves and some levy a small membership fee or other charge.

Dentist Charges

There is no suitable NHS dentistry or orthodontic service available locally, and any consultation will be charged at cost. **Routine dentist appointments should be arranged out of term time.**

Deposit

Any deposit that is paid as part of the Final Acceptance Fee prior to a boy joining Radley will be credited to the final invoice, issued after the final term at Radley.

Driving Lessons

Boys wishing to take lessons whilst at Radley should do so through the College, rather than making their own arrangements, so we can ensure a reputable company known to the College is being used. Parents are asked to authorise that their son can have driving lessons and, because of the significant cost of driving lessons, **parents are asked to pay direct.** A provisional licence (which can be applied for before the 17th birthday) must be produced before any lessons can be booked.

Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme

Gold – Operational charge - £75,

Silver – Operational charge £45, Practice expedition £150, Qualifying Expedition £150.

Bronze – Operational charge (including Expedition) - £60.

Examination Charges

A Level and GCSE examination fees for Fifth and 6.2 students are charged on the invoice just before the exams take place and for any other exam candidates on the invoice just after the exams have taken place.

Exams are generally in the range of £100 -£220 per A Level taken and approximately £68 per GCSE/IGCSE.

Field Trips

These are subsidised by the school but depending on the numbers involved there may or may not be a small charge.

However, parents will always be advised of the cost to them in advance.

Fishing

Boys will be charged a one-off fee of £30 per annum for participating in the fishing club to cover the cost of supplies and maintenance of the fish stock and environment.

Laundry/Dry Cleaning/Sewing

There is no extra charge for laundry or straightforward sewing/repairs. Dry cleaning is charged as an extra.

Materials Used

The Art, Design Technology and Electronics departments may levy a small charge for materials used.

Music Department

All instrumental and singing tuition is charged at £42 per 40-minute lesson (except music scholars and music exhibitioners for whom there is no charge). Up to 11 lessons are offered in the Michaelmas Term, approximately 8 in Lent Term and 7 in Summer Term, totalling 26 in the year. If your son is a music scholar or exhibitioner you will be invoiced for music lessons, but a corresponding credit will appear on the main fee invoice.

Please note that one term's notice in writing is required if you wish to cancel music lessons (or Leave Away to Leave Away if notice is given after the start of term).

Instrument hire is £78 per instrument, per term (£51.50 for percussion pupils). Further details are available from the Music Administrator musicadmin@radley.org.uk.

Sailing

Sailing is offered as an alternative sport at Radley during all three terms. In line with Boat Club charges, full time sailors, i.e. boys who sail Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays, are charged £130 per term to contribute towards additional costs. This charge does not apply to occasional sailors, who may only have sailed in taster sessions.

School Shop

We operate a cashless campus for food and drink purchases at the Shop and the Clocktower Court Coffee Shop. To ensure your son can make purchases on campus, we recommend that he arrives at Radley with a debit or prepayment card or has set up either Apple Pay or Android Pay on his phone.

Boys can bring a small amount of cash if necessary, which can be stored in their individual safes and used for trips to the Village Shop. A credit, debit or prepayment debit card is also advisable for outings or other expenditure at Radley.

Social and Entertainment Charges

Specific excursions or entertainment (e.g. dinners, barbecues, videos, etc) organised for the benefit of the boys are charged at cost and Socials may also make a small charge as a contribution towards general Social based activities.

Sub Aqua

PADI Open Water Referral Course is £195, PADI Diving Pack (if needed) £75. Optional diving trips may also be offered at cost from time to time.

Textbook Charges

Books will generally not be charged for unless they are provided to boys on a permanent basis, for example so they can write in them. For other books, provided within the fee, a further charge may arise if the books are returned damaged, or are lost.

Transit and Landrover Charges

The cost of team travel to away games is met by Radley. However, certain other group excursions such as to the theatre may involve a transport charge.
