 - Focus Mode on iPads.
- Encourage collaborative learning a study buddy can be hugely helpful.
- Try a range of revision techniques variety can boost memory and engagement.
- Support them with their revision schedule it should be realistic.

On Monday, all Shells will attend a Revision Strategy Talk, where we'll help them begin planning their revision. We are not expecting students to lock themselves away for the entire holiday but a structured approach to light revision over half term will help reduce stress and boost confidence when they return. Lessons and activities will continue as normal in the lead-up to the exams, so getting ahead with revision is strongly advised.

Finally, all resources, including a revision timetable template, guidance, and revision lists will be available on the Shell Revision SharePoint, which students will gain access to on Monday.




