

Our Talking Heads Parent Webinar this half of term is on the theme of gap years. Milly Whitehead founder of <u>The Leap</u>, one of the UK's leading organisations specialising in purposedriven gap year and school travel, will join our Head of Sixth Form Tim Lawson, Director of University Entrance Tom Deasy and OR Calver Barnes (2017, B) for a panel discussion on 'a year off'.

This webinar will explore the benefits and challenges for students considering taking time out before university or entering the workforce, and share practical advice on how to help students plan a purposeful and structured gap year. The panel will also discuss gap years in the context of university entrance and specific degree courses. Whether they're thinking of travelling, working, volunteering, or gaining new skills, this session will offer insightful advice so you can feel informed, reassured, and ready to support your sons in making a smart, meaningful decision.

The Mouse-Free Marion Project is an ocean wildlife conservation initiative on Marion Island in the sub-Antarctic, aiming to protect the world's iconic Wandering Albatross population. winners in a very well-fought match."

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
Reading Regatta

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





