HISTORY

26 February – 27 February 2025 Time allowed – 30 minutes

The paper consists of three primary sources and two questions. The Paper is worth a total of 9 marks.

You are expected to be able to write accurate, grammatical, well-punctuated prose throughout this paper.

Instructions

You will be awarded:

- Up to three marks for inference (points that you are able to pick out from the source);
- Up to three marks for explanation (how your inferences/points can be supported with evidence/quotation from the text);
- Up to three marks for evaluation (reflect on the source's provenance: who wrote it; what type of document it is; when it was published to reach a judgement on whether it would be useful as a piece of evidence).

Study the extracts before answering the two questions below.

Police report to Napoleon, 8 May 1809

In the town of Toulon, following the rumour of a next call of conscripts, there has been a resort to marriage as a means for young men to avoid being conscripted. On 27 April, the chief commissioner wrote that marriages had never been so numerous in this town.

Police report to Napoleon, 16 October 1809

The Prefect [Police chief] writes that, with the intention of hiding him from conscription*, a father came to the mayor of his town with the intention of registering as a *girl*, the son to whom his wife had just given birth. The Prefect notes that, within the existing laws, this is not against the law.


Police report to Napoleon, 18 October 1811

A conscript in Münster has cut off his finger to avoid military service. Questioned by the chief commissioner, he said that a relative advised him to do this and carried out the amputation. The relation of the conscript is being sought; they are both the sons of artisans.

What do these sources reveal about Napoleon's efforts to keep his armies supplied with recruits through conscription?

Would these sources be useful for a historian studying this question? Explain your answer.

*conscription is forced enrolment in military service

Question 4


Explain why managing waste effectively in cities is challenging. (8 marks)

Explain how agricultural practices can lead to desertification. (8 marks)

Explain why the impacts of volcanoes can vary between different places. (8 marks)
